The city with a future is green. Green addresses almost all pressing challenges our growing cities face. Before we start our trail Lars van Ginkel will tell us about his company Ginkel Group and the project Wonderwoods. Wonderwoods is the building right across from the Beatrix Theater. It is one of the first buildings in the city where they included so much green in the making of it.

4 Excursion at the new city of Utrecht

This trail guides us on a walking tour from
Jaarbeursplein through projects in Utrecht's new city
center promoting healthy urban living. We begin at
Jaarbeursplein near the Bomenbal of the Green Business
Club Centrum, passing the Beatrixhal to Wonderwoods,
a sustainable residential and office complex with green
facades and roofs. An optional tour with Van Ginkel and/or
Van den Berk Nurseries is available.

Next, we visit the Tuinen van Croese, where Bureau Brick discusses the park's development created through placemaking without a budget. Planned activities for the Future Green Cities World Congress include a research project by the Amsterdam University of Applied Sciences on urban pergolas' impact and an extreme green makeover over four days.

We witness Croeselaan transformed into a park avenue, accommodating slow traffic and greenery. Continuing to the Greenhouse, a temporary circular building with locally grown organic vegetables, and the Rabobank Garden. Crossing Moreelse Bridge to Moreelse Park, a greening project for a work area.

Lastly, we learn about the Singelpark, a green oasis replacing a former highway, and plans for Smakkelaarsveld and Lombokplein before returning to Jaarbeursplein. This trail showcases urban integration efforts.

Wednesday 25th of September

1 Future Green City World Congress

We start our day at the Future Green City congress with again a variety of experts! You can see the whole program here. The keynote speaker is Siew Leng Fun of Growth within limited space. Led by Siew Leng Fun, Singapore took brave measures to meet up urgent demands in city development. As Singapore's Chief Urban Designer, she shows the world how innovative and sustainable solutions mean be implemented in a planned manner, helping the city grow in a limited area. The English historian and publicist Ben Wilson wrote the critically acclaimed bestseller "Urban Jungle." In it, he takes readers on a breathtaking journey through nature in cities from the Stone Age to the present. Wilson uses compelling examples from cities worldwide to show how the balance between nature and urban environments is shifting. He suggests envisioning future cities with plants, urban farms, and forests intertwined with buildings. This new perspective can help us develop innovative, sustainable living methods in a century increasingly shaped by climate change.

3 Excursion at the new city of Utrecht

Leidsche Riin, Netherlands' largest urban expansion with 100.000 residents, showcases sustainability and climate adaptation. Its water system covers one-third of Utrecht, featuring rainwater management systems and natural infiltration beds (wadi's) integrated into the district's green infrastructure. Starting our bus tour at Jaarbeursplein, our first stop is Pecanlaan 50. Kindcentrum Riinvliet, where we explore a food forest. Riinvliet, a new neighborhood with 1.100 homes, boasts 15 hectares of public green space filled with edible greenery, co-created with residents. It's a pilot project aligning with Utrecht's strategy for healthy urban living, winning an international ecology innovation award in 2022. The municipality oversees maintenance but encourages residents to engage in self-management initiatives.

Continuing our journey, we visit Vicuslaan at Castellum Hoge Woerd in Máximapark, Utrecht's largest urban park spanning 300 hectares. The park features a reconstructed Roman castellum, now home to a theater, museum, restaurant, and city farm. Next, we explore Vlinderhof, a perennial garden in Máximapark designed by Piet Oudolf. This resident-maintained garden celebrates its 10th anniversary on May 25, 2024, drawing visitors from around the globe.

Equitable Green (Park) Investments

Three cities in the heart of America—Minneapolis, Pittsburgh, and Louisville—developed comprehensive investment action plans for their park systems to promote equitable access and investment in public parks and recreation services for all residents. These plans prioritize serving people and neighborhoods that have long been forgotten, underserved, and marginalized. In the Netherlands, the municipality of Rotterdam has interesting experiences in this area. Upload USA and NL knowledge in this Workshop XL and work on your own equitable access initiatives.
